


privacy jenga

it's ok if you make some mistakes.

although it's possible, a tower rarely falls over when removing a single block

however, a porous structure is vulnerable to even threats like a gentle breath or a mildly competent government.

when our structure is strong, it requires a stronger, assertive effort to knock over.

> which means its okay to make some mistakes. what's important is attending to your overall structure.

behold, a tower of blocks!!


we can use a tower of blocks to strengthen our intuition around what it means to stay private.

your authoritarian government identifies your bitcoin contributions to the fight for democracy, and you face the risk of jail time.


that's kind of a big deal.

communication is necessary to participate in society, but every time you communicate, you lose some privacy




& it's important to calibrate for your environment...

we have to play a different game entirely if facing a baseball bat.



the stronger your tower, the harder it is for your adversary to knock it over




low:
